In the 1960's the Hawley Cemetery opened as a Lawned Cemetery similar to the one at the Hawley Church Graveyard. Maintenance was done using a lawn mower to cut and collect the grass cuttings around headstones on each of the graves. Since the 1960's however graves have become more ornate, making it impossible for a mower to be used in the cemetery, as in former times, resulting in grass strimming being the only way of maintaining the grass between each grave. Whilst every effort is made by our contractor to minimise grass cuttings being dispersed over graves, unfortunately from time to time this is unavoidable.
